3. PREVIOUS MINUTES

MOTION: that the minutes of the Murray Darling Association (MDA) Region 6 - Ordinary Meeting held 20 May 2022 be approved as an accurate record of that meeting.

REPORTS

- 4.1. MDA CEO Report Mark Lamb
 - Membership dues were sent out in June. There have been some drop offs in membership. A membership drive will be undertaken to seek membership from Councils who currently are not members. All Regions are encouraged to engage with non-member Councils.
 - Basin Community Leadership Program Commenced in March. Reporting has been completed. An audit of the grants has occurred and sign off has been successful. This has resulted in extra funds from the Dept. of Agriculture.
 - Circular Economy initial consultation has been undertaken. Project has now finished and a draft report given to CSIRP for feedback. Further work may occur in the future.
 - 2022 AGM and Conference working with all regions to get motions in. A cocktail reception will convene at the Albury Club on the Sunday and a Study Tour of the Dartmouth and Hume Dams is planned for the Monday. The Dartmouth Dam is currently 95% full. Speakers for the conference include the Shadow Water Minister and the Hon Tanya Plibersek. A Gala Dinner will be held on the Tuesday Night at the Soldier, Sailor and Airmans Club. A local historian is the guest speaker for the evening.

QUESTIONS

- 1. Cr Rebbeck what is the cut off date for Motions and how are the other regions going with their submissions?
- 2. Cr Leng Are you looking at sending them out to the Member councils for consideration prior to the AGM? Gives the Council members the opportunity to advise their delegates on their position.

ANSWERS

- 1. Monday 15th is the due date. A lot of Regions are struggling to get them in. An extension to the end of next week has been provided. The Motions will be sent to the MDA Board for consideration and discussion. This will occur at the end of the Month.
- 2. This will be a Board decision. CEO is happy to circulate them.

4.2. Region 6 Chairs Report – Cr Rebbeck

- Great work has been undertaken by Region 6.
- Official congratulations to RCMB on the successful bid to Host the 2023 MDA Conference and AGM. Thank you to RCMB staff for putting together a successful bid.
- A number of meetings have been convened to devise and finalise Region 6 Motions
- Meetings have also been convened with Region 5 and Region 7 representatives to organise the Inter-Region Meeting. The date has now been set for 6th September.
- Lower Lakes are looking healthy. A Report on the 450GL has been attached to the Agenda for information.
- Would like to have another Ordinary Meeting before the new Councils are appointed.
- Looking forward to the AGM and Conference
- Official welcome to Carol Muzyk Region 6 Coordinator. Will be involved in the organisation of the 2023 Conference and AGM. Discussion with MDA needs to occur to determine roles and responsibilities.

QUESTIONS

- 1. Cr Leng draw members attention to the MDBA Media Release on 11 August which talks about the 450Gl and NSW Water Resource Plans. Recommends members look at the MDBA website for media releases and reports.
- Heather Barclay wishes to move a Motion to thank Cr Rebbeck for her work over the years. This is the late Ordinary Meeting as the Chair. As a region we need to formally recognise the work undertaken by Cr Rebbeck. Drove hard to have a Symposium in late 2021 which was extremely successful. Move a Motion to Formally thank Cr Rebbeck for her passion and input into Region 6.

Mayor Lewis – voiced his appreciation to Cr Rebbeck and wish her all the best in her future endeavours. Cr Scott – Support of sentiments of previous speakers with regard to recognitions of her efforts and the additional challenges she has endured.

ANSWERS

1. Cr Rebbeck – thanked members for their recognition of her efforts. Indicated she would continue to be involved in Region 6 as an Independent Member.

4.3. MDBA Report – Deanna Mildren

Talked to her report that has been tabled.

- Released Basin Plan Report Card NSW has not submitted their Water Resource Plans. Sustainable Diversion Limits are still a challenge. Northern Basin Initiatives are progressing.
- Annual Operating Outlook BOM have indicated there is a 50% chance of a La Nina happening. Most likely a wetter than average Spring. Releases from Hume Dam are up significantly and is 95% full. Dartmouth Dam is a full capacity. Some spills to SA have occurred under the MDA Water Sharing Agreement.
- Menindee Lake is full at 115%
- Flow into SA is 55,000MG per day. 150 plus gates are open. Some gates are closed to manage sea water inflow.
- Basin Condition Monitoring Projects have been announced recently by Minister Plibersek. \$7.7 million has been allocated across 15 projects.
- Region community forums are underway. SA occurs the following Tuesday.
- Listening Tour of SA is planned for late October/early November.
- Engagement Officer role has been increased to 4 days a week and recruitment is currently underway.

QUESTIONS

- 1. Stephen Packer Dredging still continues even with 55,000 MI per day?
- 2. Mayor Brendon Lewis winds are causing an issue.
- 3. Cr Leng need to be mindful of the spills across the Princess Highway
- 4. Cr Rebbeck is their flooding events likely to affect the Lower Lakes?
- 5. Cr Scott if the lake level and river level is high, it is a fine balance for Langhorne Creek as water may start to bank up south of Langhorne Creek.
- 6. Cr Leng members who are concerned about water levels and floods can refer to website Water Data SA <u>www.water.sata.sa.gov.au</u> Council staff should monitor this site.

ANSWERS

- 1. Yes dredging still continues.
- 2. If there are issues around significant rainfall upstream, there will be a few weeks notice. Dept. for Environment and Water provide weekly high flow reports. Flooding is occurring in the eastern states.

4.4. Commonwealth Environment Water Office Report – Richard Mintern

- Anyone who has the opportunity to do Dartmouth Dam Tour should do so.
- All major storages are full or near full.
- Uncertainty about inflows into Menindee Lakes. Upper NSW catchments are predicting 600-1000GL to come into Menindee Lakes.

- Little or no environmental water in the system. Slowing the recession of the flow will provide some environmental water and mitigate bank slumping.
- Overall condition of the Basin over 1800GL has been delivered throughout the Basin to value add natural flow where possible.
- Sizeable amounts of water are carried over each year.
- Best bird breeding events in 20 years have occurred and wide dispersal across the Basin

NO QUESTIONS

- 4.5. Office of Inspector General Water Compliance Report Greg Burns
 - Met with the CEO of consulting firm Stream Monitoring who are doing a project on water delivery. They estimate about 20 million cubic tonnes of silt has accumulated at the Barker Choke. Investigating how the silt can be removed and what can be done with the silt.
 - Met with Carol and Stephen from RCMB to work through the Motions for the upcoming MDA AGM
 - Met with Nathan Bignell in his new role at the FRDC.
 - The Inspector General has called out NSW Government in early June about the Water Resource Plans. He has met with Ministers Tanya Plibersek and Kevin Andrews to discuss the issue of the delays in the Water Resource Plans. 7/20 have now been submitted. None have been accredited to date.
 - Recent audi has been conducted into the Gould Murray Water. Report is on the OIGWC website.
 - SDL Compliance Report will be released Monday 15th August and will be available on website.
 - Other reports to be released over the coming months include:
 - o Des Pearson Report
 - Meeting and Measurements Report Card
 - Report on River Operations and Commonwealth Environment Water Holder Consultative Assessment
 - Boarder Rivers Trade Audit
 - o Annual Report
 - Work Plan for 22/23 has been released.
 - Commenced work on water trade and enforcement throughout the Basin

- Participated in a water compliance survey on behalf of the Inspector Generals Office. Noted the reports listed on the OIGWC website and the visits that have been undertaken in the area.
- Thanked Greg Burns for the one on one discussions.

Mayor Lewis:

• Emma Bradley put together an Executive Advisory Committee. Meetings have not been as frequent since Emma left. The new CEO will require the meetings into the future. Mayor Lewis has not attended any to date and is not likely to attend any future meetings.

• Number of votes at the AGM are Murray Bridge have two votes and Alexandrina Council have 3 votes. Independent Members are struggling to attend due to cost and time to attend the Conference. Tim Phillips advised he has been approached by other independent members for request for virtual attendance for the AGM. Cost for virtual attendance to the AGM needs to be explored. Independent Members can only vote if they are a voting delegated appointed by their Region.

- Bridget Mathers will be the voting delegate for Alexandrina Council
- Mayor Lewis and Heather Barclay will be the voting delegate for RCMB.
- Cr Rebbeck and Cr Scott will be the voting delegate for Coorong Council.

10.2. 2023 National Conference (19-21 September Murray Bridge)
