Ryan Breen and Michelle Campbell, Local Engagement Officers of the Commonwealth Environmental Water Office, gave a presentation on Commonwealth Water Assets.

Michelle is based at the Berri Office and is the local connection between Canberra and the region. Michelle is interested in hearing about any environmental water projects and wetlands that need water.

Resolved that the following motion from the Murray Darling Association Annual General Meeting held on 14 October 2014 be included in the minutes:-

Motion 7

"That the Murray Darling Association adopts, as policy, the following statements regarding Unconventional Gas.

<u>Definition</u>: Unconventional Gas is found in highly compact rock or coal beds and requires a specific set of production techniques.

"That the Murray Darling Association:

- a. Will seek to have a moratorium placed on any further Unconventional Gas activity in any Basin that may be interconnected with the Murray Darling Basin on valuable arable land and until a solution is agreed upon of how to avoid salt mobilization.
- b. Will oppose the mining and exploration of Unconventional Gas, including the practice of fracking, except where adequate guarantees based in science can demonstrate that there will be no adverse impact on the aquifers and ground water storage environment and on the quality of water contained in those aquifers and ground water storages.
- c. Will always be focused on the environment and local communities in pursuing this policy.
- d. Affirms that agricultural land is a vital and important asset and must be protected from any activities that compromises its productive capacities.
- e. Affirms that ground water is a vital and important asset and must be protected from any activity that might compromise its quality."
